A Message from the Director

Dear Friends of the Center,

Twenty years ago, the streets of Los Angeles burned in what would become the second largescale uprising in the city. The events of April 1992, known by Korean Americans as Sa-I-Gu (literally, 4-2-9) was a wake-up call -- a baptism of political, economic, and cultural dimensions. The <u>latest issue of Amerasia Journal</u> focuses on those events with insights and reflections that come with the passage of time. Darnell Hunt, Director of UCLA's Bunche Center for African American Studies and a sociologist with expertise in the subject, co-edited the issue, and it is richer for the collaboration. The Center has been part of earlier commemorations, and we are glad to be able to document and to provide additional voices and analysis at this marker. The uprisings resist any easy conclusions, but continuing to wrestle with questions and issues and how they resonate into the present fits very much into the mission of the UCLA Asian American Studies Center.
